**September 26 – November 21, 2007**

*Open Hearts – Closed Doors* marks the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the arrival, in Canada, of 1123 Jewish children orphaned by the Holocaust. This exhibit chronicles the lives of these children as they emerged from the Holocaust and made their way through displaced persons camps and orphanages, eventually to communities across Canada.
