Inuksuk: Helping Newcomers Find Their Way (Grades P-6):

Get in touch with Canada's chilly side with this engaging workshop. Students will learn about Canada's newest territory, Nunavut, as well as use the inuksuk as a model for leadership and welcoming. Students make their own inuksuk doorknob hanger.

Coming to Canada (Grades P-4):

This trunk workshop is filled with items that tell a story about the person who brought them to Canada and engages children with the struggles it takes to come to Canada.

Genealogy (Grades 4+):

In many cultures, December is about family. Learn the skills you need to begin to explore primary documents and research skills through introductions and games.

***NEW – Poppies (all ages):** Students will learn about the history and symbolism of the poppy while making their own poppies in honour of the veterans who originally hand made them in order to raise funds to support war orphans.
