*NEW - Reflections: Canada-Hungary Exhibit

Pier 21 welcomes a new traveling exhibit from the Stewart Hall Art Gallery this month. Reflections: Canada-Hungary is an exhibition of fourteen artists of Hungarian descent. This exhibit coincides with the 50th anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution. In 1956 Canada received 37000 Hungarian refugees. Today, the Hungarian community in Canada numbers over 260000. Reflections: Canada-Hungary will be at Pier 21 from October 12-November 28 2006.

Canadian Citizenship (grades 5 and up):

This workshop gets students thinking about the values, rights and responsibilities of being a Canadian citizen.

Inuksuk-Helping Newcomers Find Their Way (Primary to Gr. 6):

Students make their own Inuksuk craft and learn about Inuit culture and how to help new Canadians feel welcome.

Coming November First

Three new workshops are available starting November first 2006. In addition to being excellent educational opportunities, these workshops are designed to complement tours of our traveling Hungarian exhibits.

*NEW – **Swing Dance:** Students learn about WWII culture, learn a swing/jive basic and try out some moves.

*NEW - **Refugee Workshop:** Students will learn about the refugee system in Canada through case studies and presentations. Students will also engage in a refugee empathy exercise.

*NEW – **Recording History:** Students learn about various ways to record history. Students will also begin to create their own history through journaling. This workshop is a great literacy boost.

Pier 21 has a wide variety of programs to complement your tours of the museum.

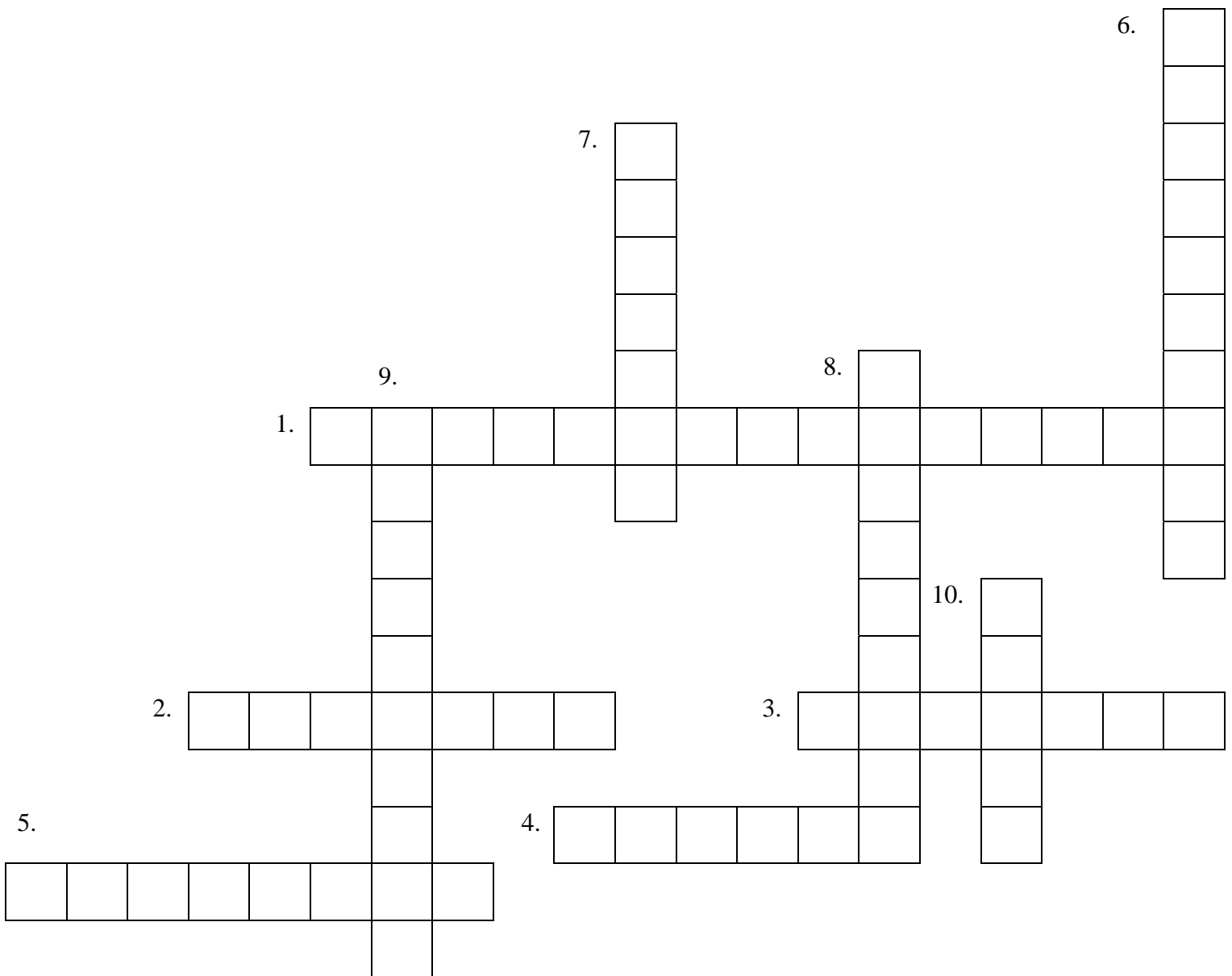
