Julius' story goes like this:

He was only really in Canada for two days.

In 1938, Julius was one of the oldest children on one of the last Kindertransports out of Germany. He was ten years old, and his mother secured his passage from Germany to London. Julie, as he was known, lived in London in a Jewish foster home until 1943. His parents managed to escape from Germany to Italy and then on to Cleveland where her sister was living. Once they arrived in Cleveland, Julie came and joined them. He was only fourteen at the time of the voyage from England to Halifax. He arrived in Halifax on August 5, 1943. Once there, he continued on to St. Alban, Vermont and arrived there on August 7, 1943.

I know that he was granted his immigration visa from the American Consul in London on July 2, 1943. I also know that he arrived via a United States Army Convoy.
