Gina Monaco was born on August 1, 1907 in Udina, community of Fagagna in the province of Del Friuli.



As a young girl she attended school up to the 3rd grade. Gina attended a Work Convent from the age of 16 until 1924. The Convent was called "Conuitto Cascami Let-Nouara". She contacted her sister in Canada and made arrangements to travel there. She had her vaccination shots on April 06, 1927 and was issued her Certificate to Immigrate to Canada on April 07, 1927.

On April 30, 1927 she left from Cherbourg France on the Red Star Liner Berlin. It was 590.2 ft. long and had 3 classes of passengers. Total number of passengers was 2700. Gina was in third class. The voyage took 7 days, she arrived at Pier 2 in

Halifax, Nova Scotia on May 07, 1927.

All passengers received a form with 28 questions they had to answer before being cleared by immigration.

On May 8, 1927, Gina travelled by train to Sault Ste. Marie. The journey took 3 days. She then met with her sister Margereta Zuiani and worked for her as a house keeper. While there she met Giuseppe Cavicchiolo.

Giuseppe Alessandro Cavicchiolo was born March 20, 1896 in Tombolo, Province of Padova, Italy. Region of Veneto..His fathers name was Angelo and his mothers name was Angela.

As a young man of 18 he sailed from Le Havre, France on the vessel S.S. La Torranine and arrived at the Port of Quebec on May 21, 1913. He also travelled by train to Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario. He worked at Algoma Steel and also a short time in Windsor Ontario. He worked as a Ladleman at the Blast Furnace. He met Gina Monaco and shortly after that on Nov 25, 1928 they married. They had 5 children, Gloria, Alberto, Angelo, Vera and Gino. Giuseppe had 2 Brothers that we know of. Gino Cavicchiolo Born Jan. 06, 1889, died April 06, 1918 of Asthma in Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario. Raffaele Cavicchiolo Born August 27, 1887, died December 29, 1935.



Giuseppe received his Citizenship and Immigration papers on January 25, 1930. He became a Canadian Citizen.

They both lived a wonderful Life together.

Giuseppe Alessandro Cavicchiolo died April 30, 1956 in Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario.

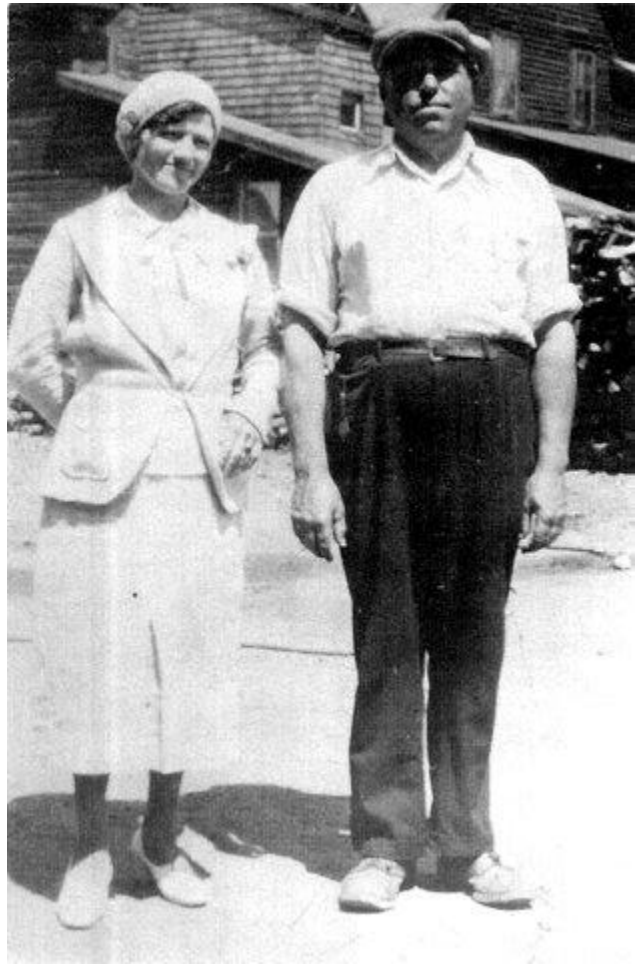
