before going overseas in 1942
at the age of 27. He was billeted
in Farnham, England, a short
train ride from London. I met
him in 1942. We courted for
about 3 years before marriage.
We also had a son in England
after the war my husband
stayed behind in England to
work on the clubs that had
been taken over by the
Canadians. He finally left for
his home in Vancouver B.C. in

February 1947 and arrived in march of 1947. So he put in about 7 years
with the Army as an Engineer. He served in Europe, Holland, Belgium
and Germany and was given five medals. I as his War Bride wife feel very
proud to have been part of his life (his serial number was K 99146).
